Pingali Venkayya Jayanthi On 02/08/2023



Pingali Venkayya (2 August 1876/8^{[1][2]} – 4 July 1963) was an Indian freedom fighter and a Gandhian. He was the designer of the flag on which the Indian National Flag was based. He was also a lecturer, author, geologist, educationalist, agriculturist, and a polyglot.

Vice-Principal G. Shekar has spoken to various flags had been used by members of the Indian independence movement prior to the independence being achieved in 1947. Pingali Venkayya designed the National Flag and presented it to Mahatma Gandhi during the latter's visit to Vijayawada city on 1 April 1921. Venkayya's first draft of the flag was in red and green — the red representing Hindus and green the Muslims living in the country. On Gandhi's suggestion, Venkayya added a white stripe to represent all other denominations and religions present in India.












Motivation and Preparation Classes-Maha Job Mela

Independence Day is celebrated annually on 15 August as a public holiday in India commemorating the nation's independence from the United Kingdom on 15 August 1947, the day when the provisions of the Indian Independence Act, which transferred legislative sovereignty to the Indian Constituent Assembly, came into effect. India retained King George VI as head of state until its transition to a republic, when the Constitution of India came into effect on 26 January 1950 (celebrated as Indian Republic Day) and replaced the dominion prefix, Dominion of India, with the enactment of the sovereign law Constitution of India. India attained independence following the independence movement noted for largely non-violent resistance and civil disobedience led by Indian National Congress under the leadership of Mahatma Gandhi.

Independence Day was celebrated with great respect and enthusiasm. The program started at 9:00 am with large crowd of students and staff. To commemorate the sovereignty of our nation Principal Dr. K. Ratna Manikyam hoisted the flag followed by speech where he spoke on the freedom fighters who played important role in Indian Independence. Later, students in their melodious voice sang patriotic songs followed by cultural programs. Tanguturi Prakasam Panthulu Jayanthi

Tanguturi Prakasam Panthulu (23 August 1872 – 20 May 1957) was an Indian jurist, political leader, social reformer, and anti-colonial nationalist who served as the chief minister of the Madras Presidency. Prakasam subsequently became the first chief minister of the erstwhile Andhra State, created by the partition of Madras State along the linguistic lines. Prakasam was known as "Andhra Kesari" which translates to "Lion of Andhra". The Andhra Pradesh government issued G.O RT-2500 on 10 August 2014 declaring his birth anniversary a state holiday.

It was first celebrated in 1971, designated by Congress in 1973, and is proclaimed each year by the United States President.

Mother Teresa is known to all the world for the kind of humane person she was. She is known for her selfless attitude towards needy and helpless people. On August 26 1910, she was born in Skopje, Macedonia, and came to India at the age of 18 after becoming a nun. She decided to live the rest of her life as a nun. Mother Teresa founded Missionaries of Charity, a religious congregation, which grew to have over 4,500 nuns across 133 countries. Mother Teresa received several honours, including the 1962 Ramon Magsaysay Peace Prize and the 1979 Nobel Peace Prize. A controversial figure during her life and after her death, Mother Teresa was admired by many for her charitable work
